# Vein & Pattern *Guide*



## Introduction

We have created this guide to assist you in creating optimal pattern continuity in the design and fabrication of countertops, backsplashes and drop-down ends. Here you will see full slab layout images of each model with our suggested pattern continuity visual.

Caesarstone slabs are available in large sizes. This means that in the vast majority of designed applications no horizontal surface-to-surface butt joins are required. Where continuity is required, we invite you to use these design layout images as a guide to optimal pattern continuity.

Please note that the instructions in the Caesarstone Fabrication & Installation Guides should be followed at all stages.

## Design considerations

Every designed application with Caesarstone slabs has a unique combination of layout, kitchen size and aesthetic considerations. Note that the pattern continuity visuals suggested in this guide are conceptual and not according to dimension.

We recommend that planning pattern continuity for each project be based on but not limited to the following:


- Overall project size
- Consider countertop, backsplash and drop-down end requirements
- Maximise slab usage and minimise offcuts

- The relative strength or subtlety of a vein or pattern structure in the selected Caesarstone colour
- Consider how to best utilise the slab size during design, taking into account any desired pattern direction alignment
- Prior to cutting any slabs ensure that all components reflect the design layout
- Consider the colour and tonality of the slab design to ensure the best final appearance when joins are required
- For applications requiring joins and pattern continuity, we recommend purchasing all slabs at the same time for matching as it may not be possible to batch match slabs bought separately




## Planning Joins in Porcelain Countertops

As a general rule, when there is a change of direction in the slab make only straight joins, not diagonal or rounded joins. Use diagonal joins only when necessary for continuation of veins or a pattern in the slab.



A rounded corner may be fabricated in a single thickness slab where there is a corner/niche no greater than 70mm, and it is not connected to another slab.

A 90° corner may be created if the slab has a mitre edge profile.







In diagonal corner countertops a join must be created in one of the corners. If the countertop is single thickness, create a radius of at least 35mm in the other corner.

For indents from the edge of a slab, for example around a pillar: for slab lengths up to 1600mm, drill holes in the 2 corners; for slab lengths over 1600mm, drill a hole in one corner and create a straight join from the other.

- When installing the countertop, fill the seams between the slabs with adhesive specifically for Porcelain that matches the countertop in colour, with properties suitable for the installation environment (indoors and outdoors).
- If the slabs are inconsistent in appearance, check the pieces to be joined in advance to achieve the best possible match.
- Clean each slab piece with clean water at the end of each fabrication stage before it dries.






